

FAST transit is a scalable approach for quickly integrating "transit advantage" infrastructure along the roadway system to support enhanced transit service. The "FAST" approach prioritizes transit efficiency and reliability while improving mobility for all users.


A regional **FAST network** is a series of interconnected FAST corridors with transit advantage infrastructure that can deliver rapid, frequent, and easy-to-use transit service.

I-40 (I-5111, U-4739, U-6093):

- 14 miles of widening and modernization from I-440 to Cornwallis Road in Johnston Co.
- \$432M Design Build Project
- Complete to US 70 Freeway / Future I-42 at future 540
- Cleveland Road interchange will be fully open this month (August 2024)
- Substantial Completion of entire project by next month (September 2024)
- Relieve congestion for all modes of travel; existing BOSS corridor



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








I-40 Interchange at Airport Blvd (I-5700):

- Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) over I-40
- Pedestrian Accommodations thru DDI
- Auxiliary lanes on I-40, EB & WB
- Connects with similar project recently completed on I-40 at Aviation Parkway
- \$35M Project
- Completion in Summer 2025







I-440 Walnut to Wade (U-2719, U-4437):

- 5.5 miles; Oldest Section of I-440 Beltline
- \$346M Design Build Project
 - Includes Blue Ridge Rd. grade separation
- Widening from 4 to 6 lanes
- Reconstructing interchanges, bridges, pavement – modernizing the roadway
- Highly Phased Construction
- U-2719 Substantial Completion Fall 2025
- U-4437 Substantial Completion Winter 2025




Blue Ridge Road / Hillsborough Street Grade Separation (U-4437)




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
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




I-40 in Research Triangle Park:

- Strategic Truck Corridor (7-10K trucks/day)
- 5 Major Interchanges:
 - 1-885, 1-540
 - Davis Drive, Miami Blvd, Page Road
- Numerous merges/diverges







I-40 in Research Triangle Park:

- Estimated Cost \$500.4M
- Not in 2024-2033 STIP
- Did not score sufficiently in Prioritization P7.0 for selection on the Statewide Tier
- Continuing to evaluate strategies



Request

In early 2024, NCDOT received a request from CAMPO to explore alternative funding options. RTA and the Town of Wake Forest recently sent NCTA a letter, reaffirming support.



Current Status

In coordination with CAMPO, Traffic and Revenue work is underway, including expressway and express lanes options.



Next Steps

The Traffic and Revenue analysis is expected to complete before the end of the year. NCDOT will present findings to CAMPO.



I-440/US 64 to US 70 Eastbound




Area 1: Travel Times I-440 to US 70






NC 54 to Harrison Ave Eastbound

Area 2: **Travel Times NC 54 to Harrison Ave**




