- SS (Silver Star) trains do not serve Durham; these trains continue south from Cary towards Miami.
- Trains P-71 (westbound) and P-76 (eastbound) travel between Raleigh and Charlotte in under 3 hours.

Route information

Piedmont trains travel between Raleigh, Cary, Durham and Charlotte. All trains stop in Greensboro. All trains have one or more additional stops; see <u>this page</u> to confirm which trains stop at which stations. NCDOT owns all Piedmont train equipment, which provides most of our regional rail service today.

Carolinian trains travel between New York and Charlotte, with stops in Raleigh, Cary, and Durham. There are <u>several other stations</u> including Washington DC, Richmond, Rocky Mount, Wilson, Selma, Burlington and Greensboro.

Silver Star trains travel between New York and Miami, with stops in Raleigh and Cary. There are <u>several other</u> <u>stations</u> including Washington DC, Richmond, and Rocky Mount, as well as Southern Pines and Orlando.

Timetable information

When reviewing all <u>NCDOT route timetables</u> and selected <u>Amtrak route timetables</u> serving our region, eastbound = northbound and westbound = southbound.

For westbound trains: Raleigh and Cary times shown are departures and Durham times are arrivals, except for train SS-91 (Cary time shown is arrival).

For eastbound trains: Durham and Cary times shown are departures, and Raleigh times are arrivals.

For Piedmont trains, all scheduled arrival and departure times are less than 5 minutes apart.

For Carolinian trains, arrival and departure times for Durham and Cary stations are less than 5 minutes apart; the time between arrival and departure for Raleigh Union Station exceeds 5 minutes.

For Silver Star trains, the time between arrival and departure for both Cary and Raleigh stations exceeds 5 minutes.
