The Regional Transportation Alliance provides business leadership to enhance regional mobility. The Alliance worked with local, regional, state, and federal partners to successfully advance a number of key transportation project and policy priorities during 2009.

Top Successes of the Alliance and Region in 2009

- Successfully advocated for local transit options legislation, providing communities more control over their mobility future.
- » I-40 Cary/Raleigh widening underway after successful advocacy for quicker, simpler widening.
- » 540/Triangle Expressway turnpike under construction, culminating years of successful lobbying efforts at the local, regional, and state levels.
- Coordinated initial I-40 Regional Partnership initiative to advance the future of the Triangle's "Main Street."
- » Conducted Alliance Leadership Briefing and Tour to Dallas that identified transit options.
- » Achieved passage of turnpike bond flexibility legislation needed to advance the turnpike.
- » Held RTA Solutions Forum 13 which highlighted low-cost intersection solution opportunities.
- » Reviewed Raleigh Comprehensive Plan and Durham and Raleigh Capital Improvement Programs.
- » Partnered with RDU Airport to commemorate the 10th anniversary of Southwest Airlines at RDU.
